More than 700 young women have registered as community distributors in return for a menstrual cup – and a goat. This deal is just one innovative distribution model being tested by Innovation Fund-recipient Womena, which has, in its first quarter, leveraged an additional €2,600, professional *pro-bono* advertising and design services, and a donation of 1,164 menstrual cups.

The importance of skilled supply chain managers

It was the Indian Ocean tsunami at the end of 2004, and the resulting supply chain chaos, that led Pamela Steele to start up Pamela Steele Associates (PSA), a consulting, research and training company dedicated to improving supply chain management (SCM) in health and humanitarian sectors. In this <u>latest addition</u> to the *Who's Holding Up Our Pillars?* profile series, Pamela speaks passionately on the need to improve supply chain management skills in order to save lives.

All about the CSP, now in French

Last year, the CSP group (Coordinated Supply Planning) helped meet the needs of 14 countries. They did so by:

- Delaying or canceled shipments of 515,000 implants, avoiding overstocks;
- Reallocating or expediting shipments of 637,000 implants to avoid shortages and stockouts;
- Mobilizing UNFPA, USAID, and DFID to procure of an additional 900,000 implants, thereby providing over 3 million couple years of protection (CYPs) and potentially averting over one million unintended pregnancies.

The group's rationale and achievements are presented in a handy <u>fact sheet</u>, now available in **French**.

Webinar walks through Commodity Gap Analysis 2016

What kind of funding gap are we likely to confront by 2020? The recently-published **Global Contraceptive Commodity Gap Analysis** addresses this and other key questions around contraceptive use and costs, and projects a \$233M funding gap for contraceptive supplies in 2020 alone. 82 participants attended a **webinar** presented by RHSC Director John Skibiak, Michelle Weinberger from Avenir Health, and CHAI's Mindy Scibilia; the webinar makes the latest addition to the RHSC's repository of 52 webinar recordings.

Coalition reaches 413 with the addition of three new members

- Mann Global Health is a US-based company working in social marketing, social franchising, and market research and designs market development approaches for RH commodities.
- Based in the Netherlands, <u>RNW Media</u> is an NGO working with young people 15-30 using online tools to reach millions of young people in China, Sub-Saharan Africa, and the Middle East and North Africa region with information about how to make choices around their bodies.
- The <u>Radha Paudel Foundation</u> takes on superstitions and taboos in rural Nepal
 that lead to violence against women, the banishment of menstruating women to
 cowsheds, and barriers to children's education. It was founded by Coalition
 supporter Radha Paudel who attends Coalition events regularly.
